

Injectables

Botox is produced from the bacterium *Clostridium botulinum*, which is commonly associated with food poisoning. In small, diluted amounts, however, Botox can be injected directly into specific muscles, causing a controlled weakening.

Collagen is the main protein found in connective tissue. It supports the skin, bone, cartilage and blood vessels.
